SECOND AMENDMENT TO INTERNAL OPERATING PROCEDURE 99-8

ORDER

Pursuant to Uniform State Court Rule 33.1 and in order to provide for the prompt disposition of the traffic cases assigned to this Court, the Traffic Violations Bureau Order 99-8 ("Order") and the Amendment to Internal Operating Procedure 99-8 filed on October 30, 2000, are hereby further amended effective July 17, 2001, as follows:

1. Section 7 (J) is deleted in its entirety and shall be replaced with the following:

Section 7.

J. The Traffic Violations Bureau is authorized to accept nolo contendere pleas and all fines in connection therewith as to all offenses set forth on Exhibit "C" of the amended Internal Operating Procedure 99-8 filed on October 30, 2000, except those offenses that are listed as "See Judge" offenses. All nolo contendere pleas shall meet the following conditions:

(i) The person tendering the nolo contendere plea shall not have tendered a nolo contendere plea or have been found guilty of any Traffic Violations Bureau offense within the last five (5) years;

(ii) The offense shall not involve an accident in which any interested party shall have received any physical injury or property damage requiring restitution;

(iii) No objection is raised by any interested party; and

(iv) Consent by the Solicitor General of Forsyth County.

In the event that the above conditions cannot be complied with in full, a plea of nolo contendere shall be received only upon the Defendant appearing personally in open court before the Judge of the State Court of Forsyth County.

2. All remaining provisions in the Traffic Violations Bureau Order 99-8 ("Order") and the Amendment to Internal Operating Procedure 99-8 filed on October 30, 2000, except as specifically amended pursuant hereto shall remain in full force and effect.
